Students will learn a variety of techniques including coil, pinch, and slab building as well as glazing and alternative forms of surface decoration. Please bring pottery tools to use in class.

After these exercises, we will make our Jomon vessel incorporating some of the ornate elements found on these pottery forms. All levels welcome.
