Working from a live model, participants will learn specific techniques for rendering heads and figures that are solid, convincing, and alive. We will use both nude and clothed models. The course will begin with black and white studies, and color will be introduced as the quarter progresses. This course will include a combination of exercises and demonstrations. While creating both abstracts and semi-abstracts, students will be encouraged to work with a variety of media with an emphasis on acrylics. The students' knowledge and skills will be evaluated along with their needs and goals, so they can create successful painting. Subjects to be explored: still life, landscape, an interior, portrait, and a floral. Work will be critiqued in class. Instructor demonstrations will stress the basics of good composition, value (tone), and color, as well as light will be emphasized. Students will be instructed on how to execute larger paintings from their original work including research on subject matter, needed composition changes and materials.

Gain the skills that will allow you to paint fresh, life like paintings that express the light and excitement of the landscape. A great way to enjoy your local landscape and record your travels. We'll review materials the essentials for painting outside. Six classes will be taught in the Chastain Park area. Each will start with a demo stressing the basics of good outdoor painting: composition, value (tone) and color. The goal will be for everyone to execute a finished painting on every field session. We will paint the park, gardens, street scenes, historical architecture and more. There will be a one class in the studio on how enlarge your work and tips on showing your work. Including varnishing, framing and presentation. We will also review local competition opportunities. This class requires proper equipment and some prior drawing or painting experience in oil paint, acrylic or watercolor. Students must be able to set up their own equipment and deal with some standing/walking and varying weather conditions.

CERAMICS

Students may select from either wheel or handbuilding classes for all skill levels. Chastain offers the following firing options: high fire in a gas fired reduction kiln, Cone 6 and low fire oxidation, raku and experimental techniques such as Sagggar firings.

Considered one of the oldest pottery in the world, ancient Japanese Jomon pottery from 14,500–300 BCE is known for its intricate designs, especially those from the Middle Jomon period. This handbuilding class will begin by creating small “sample” forms practicing the “flame” and rope decorations. After these exercises, we will make our Jomon vessel incorporating some of the ornate elements found on these pottery forms. All levels welcome.

Topics will include: design/layout, cutting/sawing/piercing, soldering, bezel stone setting, and finishing. Continuing students will work on projects with instructor supervision. All tools are available in the studio but we encourage students to acquire their own basic tool kits. Come to first class with drawing notebook and mechanical pencil. Silver is available for purchase from the instructor. A materials fee of approximately \$10 will be collected from each student the first class.

Any cancellation of or change made to a scheduled class will be made a minimum of two days prior to the first-class meeting. *Students will be notified using the e-mail or phone number provided at the time of registration.* Full refunds will be issued for cancelled classes.

REFUND POLICY:

Students must notify the Center personally in order to withdraw from a class. A written request sent to ChastainArts@AtlantaGA.gov is required for all withdrawals and refund requests. Please include your name, the name of the class, and—if requesting a refund—your reason for withdrawal.
