**Ages 12-17**

During this course, students will learn the basics of handbuilding using techniques ranging from pinching, coiling, and slab building. These skills can be used to create a variety of functional objects: vases, cups, bowls, etc. Students will also learn how to create textures and designs on their pieces as well as get learn different glazing techniques, thus developing their own personal creativity.

**Ages 12-17**

This class is designed to provide teens with the basics of drawing. Students will learn about creating space and form on a two-dimensional surface using one, two- and three-point perspective. Working with graphite and charcoal, they will develop their understanding of value and by working from still-life objects. Students will need a T-square and a triangle for this class, in addition to drawing pencils (HB, B, 2B, 8B) and paper (no larger than 18"x24").

While learning about the history of collage, students will create exciting 2D and 3D mixed media works that emphasize the use of color, texture, and imagery. Inspired by such masters as Matisse, Picasso, and Nevelson, students will be taken through the collage process, from painting and drawing techniques, to composition and assemblage, and then to completion.

## HANDBUILDING / SCULPTURE

Handbuilding/Sculpture classes focus on the sculptural aspects of clay construction without the use of a potter's wheel. Students will learn a variety of techniques including coil, pinch, and slab building as well as glazing and alternative forms of surface decoration. Please bring pottery tools to use in class.

### INTRODUCTION TO HANDBUILDING/ Randall Moody

Thu 6:30PM-9:00PM 9/5-11/7 Fee: \$250 Class ID: 1.014.301.10

If you've always wanted to work in clay and didn't know where to start, this is the class for you. We will explore handbuilding techniques such as pinch, coil and slab. Basic glazing and surface treatments will be taught as well. You will leave this class with a strong foundation in the tools and techniques possible when using clay as well as some beautiful one of a kind art work of your own!

### **NEW!** HUMAN ANATOMY IN CLAY/ Iris Eve Schaeer

Let's train our brains to sculpt what we see in the classical human form! The first half of this course will focus on the anatomical realism in clay with two live model sessions (additional model fees will be collected after the session has begun). We will then explore sculpting portrait busts. The class structure will be hands-on instruction and demonstrations focusing on anatomical structure. A general knowledge of human anatomy will be helpful, but not necessary!

### **NEW!** FIGURE SCULPTURE/ Iris Eve Schaeer

In this course, we will explore sculpting the human and animal forms focusing on the stylistic narrative. Our goal is three finished projects inspired by prompts presented by Iris in a relaxed studio environment. Every 2-3 weeks there will be a project prompt to inspire creativity in sculptural ceramics. This class will have a laid-back studio culture with hands-on instruction and demonstrations. All experience skill levels are welcome.

This handbuilding class will focus on the creation of clay forms without the use of a potter's wheel. ### **PRE-HISTORIC JAPANESE JOMON POTTERY/** Hellenne Vermillion

Considered one of the oldest pottery in the world, ancient Japanese Jomon pottery from 14,500–300 BCE is known for its intricate designs, especially those from the Middle Jomon period. This handbuilding class will begin by creating small “sample” forms practicing the “flame” and rope decorations. After these exercises, we will make our Jomon vessel incorporating some of the ornate elements found on these pottery forms. All levels welcome.

This class will explore fabrication tools and techniques while participants make their own jewelry. We will complete as many personal pieces as we can while learning the basics of jewelry and metalsmithing. Topics will include: design/layout, cutting/sawing/piercing, soldering, bezel stone setting, and finishing. Continuing students will work on projects with instructor supervision. All tools are available in the studio but we encourage students to acquire their own basic tool kits. Come to first class with drawing notebook and mechanical pencil. Silver is available for purchase from the instructor. A materials fee of approximately \$10 will be collected from each student the first class.

#### **NEW! BEGINNING ENAMELING/** Louella Simpson

This small, personalized class includes basic instruction in enameling. New and old techniques using watercolor, bull's-eye glass, copper, silver, and other items to create paintings on metal and one-of-a-kind jewelry designs are explored. A materials fee of approximately \$20 will be collected from each student at the first class.
